# PROGRAMS & SERVICES



## Special Focus Areas

*Supported by grant funding*

**Lead:** A program offering free educational sessions on decreasing lead exposure; focusing on young children and pregnant women. Call for more information about lead testing.

**Prescription Drug Abuse Workgroup:** Working with the community to identify, treat and reduce prescription drug abuse through awareness and prevention. Workgroup meetings are held monthly.

**Safe Sleep:** A program dedicated to raising awareness of safe infant sleep (ABC-alone, back, crib) to reduce infant deaths. Free educational sessions available.

**The Second Chance Naloxone Program:** A free confidential Naloxone Rescue Kit training and distribution program for those who use opioids or family/friends of users. Trainings are held monthly or call for an appointment.

**Smoke Free Community Team:** Dedicated to protecting the public and environmental health by working to eliminate smoking-related hazards through prevention, education and advocacy. Team meetings are held monthly.

Local authority and control is provided to the Health Department by the St. Clair County Board of Commissioners. The B.O.C. has appointed a six member Board of Health who meet monthly and serve in an advisory capacity and as a review board for department activities and policies.

Dedicated to illness prevention, health promotion and preservation of the population's health.

### Clinic Services

- Confidential Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) testing, diagnosis, treatment, counseling and education
- Anonymous and confidential HIV testing and risk assessment counseling
- Pregnancy testing and referral

### Family Planning

- Voluntary, confidential and affordable high quality reproductive health care for men, women and teens
- Information on birth control and sexual health
- Pregnancy testing and counseling

### Immunizations

- Infant, childhood, adolescent, and adult vaccines with consultation
- Travel vaccines and consultation
- Immunization nonmedical waiver education
- TB testing and education students/employees
- Communicable disease prevention and control

### Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS)

- Health insurance for medically eligible children with chronic, disabling and/or terminal conditions
- Care coordination including referrals and advocacy for specialty supplies, equipment and services

### Hearing and Vision Screening

- Hearing screenings for grades Kindergarten, 2 and 4 onsite and in a variety of community settings and schools
- Vision screenings for grades 1, 3 and 5 onsite and in a variety of community settings and schools

- Nutritious foods are provided along with education and counseling to help improve the diet

## ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Designed to assure a safe and healthy environment to all county residents.

- Community outreach events and environmental health education
- Evaluations and inspections of on-site water supply and sewage disposal systems
- Inspections and assessments of household lead and asbestos and provide radon test kits
- Inspections of fixed/temporary food service facilities, adult/childcare facilities, body art establishments and campgrounds
- Investigations of foodborne outbreaks/illnesses and other environmental complaints
- Management of watershed water quality plans, oversight of storm water permits and illicit discharge elimination
- Monitoring public beaches and inspections of swimming facilities
- Permits and inspections of residential/commercial sewage disposal systems, private and non-community public water supplies, soil erosion and sedimentation control.
